Introduction

A snippet is an important file used for single-sourcing that acts sort of like a miniature topic. In a snippet, you can insert and format text, tables, pictures, and whatever else can be included in a normal topic. We're not usually talking about single words or phrases; that's what variables are for. A snippet can be inserted into one or more topics throughout your project. You can even insert them into other snippets, creating nested snippets.



★ EXAMPLE

Let's say you are writing a manual about dogs. In one topic, you have created a colorful table with images that lists the top five breeds. Let's say you want to place that same table in seven other topics. You have a choice. (1) You can re-create that table manually in each of those topics. (2) You can copy the first table and paste it into the other topics. This is a better solution, but if you need to make changes to the table in the future, you'll need to do so in all eight topics. (3) You can create a snippet from the table and insert it into each of the other topics. This is the best solution because, if you need to make changes in the future, you only need to do so within the snippet and the changes are automatically reflected in all eight topics.

4 CHAPTER 1

Following are Analyzer tasks associated with snippets.

- View and Convert Snippet Suggestions You can view content that matches existing snippets in your project, and you can quickly convert these occurrences to snippets. You can also double-click a row to open the topic in question, with the potential snippet content highlighted. See "Viewing Snippet Suggestions" on page 6.
- Convert Frequent Segments to Snippets You can view a list of segments that occur frequently in your project. You can see the segment text, the number of occurrences of each segment, and the number of words and characters in each segment.
 - If you notice that certain segments are repeated numerous times in your project, you can easily convert them to snippets or variables. For more information see "Converting Segments to Snippets" on page 10.
- View Topics With Snippet Conditions You can view a list of all files where snippet conditions have been applied. You can also double-click a row to open the topic in question. See "Files with Snippet Conditions" on page 13.
- Replace Existing Snippets with New Snippets After you create or add a new snippet to your project, you can insert it into any of your topics. Later, if you decide that a different snippet is a better fit for the topic, you can select a new snippet to replace it.

CHAPTER 2 6

HOW TO VIEW SNIPPET SUGGESTIONS

- 1. Open a project.
- 2. Do one of the following, depending on the part of the user interface you are using:
 - Ribbon Select the View ribbon. In the Dynamic Reports section, select Suggestions > Snippet Suggestions.
 - Analyzer Summary Window Pane Double-click the row that mentions snippet suggestions.
- 3. To see more of the information in the window pane, drag the divider bar to make the pane wider:
 - Apply Displays a check box next to the suggestion. If you decide to replace the content with the suggested snippet, you need to make sure the check box is selected. If you do not want to replace the content with the snippet, but you do want to replace other content in the list, you can click the check box to remove the check mark.
 - Suggestion Displays the suggestion that Analyzer is making to you (i.e., "Replace with Snippet").
 - Snippet Path Displays the location in your project's Content Explorer where the snippet is found, as well as the name of the snippet (e.g., Resources/Snippets/NewSnippet.flsnp).
 - File Displays the path and name of the file where the content in question is found.
 - Folder Displays the folder where the file is found.
 - Xml Text Displays the exact XML tag structure of the content in question.
- 4. If a certain number of items have been found, page navigation buttons in the local toolbar may be enabled. You can use these buttons to go to additional pages to display more items. You also have the option to view all items at once in one long list. This is called the View All option. You can toggle these views by clicking the View All/View as Pages button in the local toolbar. The button displays the opposite of whatever view is currently activated (e.g., If the View All option is currently active, the button shows View as Pages to indicate that if clicked, the button will switch the window pane to the View as Pages option).

CHAPTER 2 7

HOW TO CONVERT SUGGESTIONS TO SNIPPETS

Do one of the following, depending on whether you want to convert multiple suggestions to a snippet simultaneously, or if you want to convert only one snippet suggestion at a time.

TO CONVERT MULTIPLE SUGGESTIONS SIMULTANEOUSLY

- 1. In the window pane, select all suggestions that you want to convert. If you want to select all rows click . You can hold the SHIFT key to select a range, or you can hold the CTRL key to select individual items.
- 2. In the local toolbar, click the **Apply** button.
- 3. In the message that opens, click **OK**. Another message lets you know how many files were changed.
- 4. Click **OK**. All of the selected suggestions are converted to snippets.



NOTE: If you want to undo the conversions, you can use the Backups window pane (View > Backups).

TO CONVERT ONE SUGGESTION AT A TIME

- 1. In the Snippet Suggestions window pane, select the row that you want to convert to a snippet.
- 2. Select **File > Send to Flare**. The file opens in the application with the suggested content highlighted.
- In Flare, insert the snippet (e.g., select Insert > Snippet).
 See the online Help in Flare for more information about inserting snippets.
- NOTE: Keep in mind that in order for content to be found and included in the Snippet Suggestions window pane, it must match the tag of the existing snippet exactly. For example, let's say that your snippet is a paragraph within a div tag. If you simply type the same text as the snippet on a simple paragraph in a topic, that content will not be found by Analyzer as a snippet suggestion. However, if you were to place that paragraph within a div tag in the topic, then it would be found as a snippet suggestion.

NOTE: You can also include this information in reports that you create.

Converting Segments to Snippets

You can view a list of segments that occur frequently in your project. You can see the segment text, the number of occurrences of each segment, and the number of words and characters in each segment. If you notice that certain segments are repeated numerous times in your project, you can easily convert them to snippets.

CHAPTER 3 10

HOW TO CONVERT A FREQUENT SEGMENT TO A SNIPPET

- 1. Open the Frequent Segments window pane.
- 2. Select the segment that you want to convert to a snippet.
- 3. In the local toolbar, click the **Create** drop-down button and select **Create Snippet**. The Create Snippet dialog opens.
- 4. In the **Snippet File** field, type a new name for the snippet.
 - It is recommended that you leave the project folder selection as "Resources/Snippets" (or select a subfolder that you have created in the Snippets folder). After the snippet is created, you can see the snippet file in the Content Explorer of the Flare project.
- 5. Click Create. The snippet is created and added to the Flare project that you are analyzing.
- 6. Open the Snippet Suggestions window pane.
- 7. Do one of the following, depending on whether you want to convert multiple suggestions simultaneously, or if you want to convert only one snippet suggestion at a time.

TO CONVERT MULTIPLE SUGGESTIONS SIMULTANEOUSLY

- a. In the window pane, select all suggestions that you want to convert. If you want to select all rows click . You can hold the SHIFT key to select a range, or you can hold the CTRL key to select individual items.
- b. In the local toolbar, click the **Apply** button.
- c. In the message that opens, click **OK**. Another message lets you know how many files were changed.
- d. Click **OK**. All of the selected suggestions are converted to snippets.

NOTE: If you want to undo the conversions, you can use the Backups window pane (View > Backups).

CHAPTER 3 11

TO CONVERT ONE SUGGESTION AT A TIME

- a. In the Snippet Suggestions window pane, select the row that you want to convert to a snippet.
- b. Select **File > Send to Flare**. The file opens in the application with the suggested content highlighted.
- c. In Flare, insert the snippet (e.g., select Insert > Snippet).See the online Help in Flare for more information about inserting snippets.



CHAPTER 4 13

HOW TO VIEW TOPICS WITH SNIPPET CONDITIONS

- 1. Open a project.
- 2. Select the View ribbon. In the Dynamic Reports section select More Reports > Files With Snippet Conditions.
 - The Files With Snippet Conditions window pane opens, displaying all files in your project where snippet conditions have been applied.
- 3. To see more of the information in the window pane, drag the divider bar to make the pane wider:
 - File Displays the name of the file.
 - Location Displays the location of the snippet condition (e.g., topic, snippet block).
 - Folder Displays the folder where the file is found.
 - **Expression** Displays the condition expression used.
- 4. If a certain number of items have been found, page navigation buttons in the local toolbar may be enabled. You can use these buttons to go to additional pages to display more items. You also have the option to view all items at once in one long list. This is called the View All option. You can toggle these views by clicking the View All/View as Pages button in the local toolbar. The button displays the opposite of whatever view is currently activated (e.g., If the View All option is currently active, the button shows View as Pages to indicate that if clicked, the button will switch the window pane to the View as Pages option).

5. You can open any file in the list to view or modify it. You can open the file in the Analyzer interface or in the Flare project.

TO OPEN THE FILE IN THE ANALYZER INTERFACE

Double-click the file in the window pane. The benefit of using this method is that it is quick and convenient. You have access to the features normally available in the editor (but not necessarily to all of the features available elsewhere in Flare).

TO OPEN THE FILE IN FLARE

- a. In the window pane, click on the file.
- b. Select File > Send to Flare.

The benefit of using this method is that you have access to all of the features in the application, not just those available from the editor.
